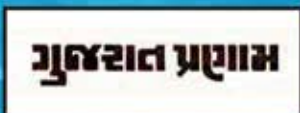
PRESS BRIEFING AT VIZAG, 3rd February, 2016

FRP Boats to be Displayed at Maritime Exhibition

Visakhapatnam: The Mumbai-based SHM Shipcare, one of the largest manufacturers of FRP (fibre reinforced plastic) boats in India, is all set to strengthen the Indian Navy with its range of indigenously built immediate support vessels (ISVs) over the next five years. The company has already supplied 14 ISVs to the Indian Navy and is expected to supply more in the coming years.

Speaking to newsmen here on Wednesday, company chairman Saifuddin Hajee said the company was also supplying craft to ONGC to ferry men and materials to its offshore structures. "Our fibre-matte high-speed and light weight vessels are men and material. Compared to helicopters being used for this purpose, our boats come in handy. Similarly, our boats are faster and take one-third of time consumed by the metal-body boats in use," he explained. He felt that the FRP boats also can be highly useful in the proposed inland waterways project of the Indian government for speedy transportation of people and material.

The company managing partner Aliasgar Hajee said the SHM was striving for innovation, indigenisation, and self-reliance on the boats.



Mumbai company to build hovercraft for Coast Guard

Visakhapatnam: Mumbai-based company SHM Shipcare will build hovercrafts for the Indian Coast Guard, which is embarked on expanding its surveillance system.

The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) has till now conducted three of the 12 new Air Cushion Vehicles (ACVs), popularly known as hovercrafts, designed and built by British firm Griffon Hoverworks Limited.

However, the ICG was not very happy with the performance of the ACVs and their suitability to Indian conditions.

"This is where we step in. We had already discussed with the Defence Ministry officials and they sounded positive," said the chairman of SHM Group Saifuddin Hajee. The group is here to exhibit its range of immediate support vessels (ISV) and life boats that are manufactured in line with the Indian naval indigenisation plan.

Mr. Hajee said the company was in line with the Indian policy, at the new exhibition, and the Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu on Wednesday.

SHM Shipcare eyes growth in high speed crafts

Visakhapatnam: There is a high demand for lightweight high speed crafts and it is set to increase, said chairman of SHM Shipcare Saifuddin Hajee. According to him, transportation of men and material on waterways is set to increase in the coming years.

Addressing a press meet in the city on Wednesday, Hajee said high speed crafts such as the rigid inflatable boat and crew boats will be useful at oil rigs for transportation of cargo and hulls of now, he said. "They are being used as the most costlier as compared to boats."

He said SHM Shipcare, which is showcasing its quality marine safety products such as FRP boats, Sa-fin 420 life boats, inflatable life-rafts, inflatable boats, life safety equipment and fire safety equipment, at the exhibition organised as part of the International Fleet Review (IFR) is also looking at promoting tourism by making yachts and luxury boats available for common people.

However, he said that once the requisite infrastructure for these luxury boats are put in place along the coast, it would be possible to build them at their yard.

SHM Shipcare, a Mumbai-based company, has so far supplied 14 immediate support vessels (ISVs) to the Indian Navy and is expecting more orders, according to Saifuddin Hajee, Chairman of the company. He was addressing the media here on Wednesday, as his company is participating in the maritime exhibition being conducted here by the navy as part of the International Fleet Review from February 4 to 8.

Hajee said his company was displaying its latest maritime products ranging from FRP boats, SA-FIN 420 life boats, inflatable life rafts, inflatable boats, life safety equipment and fire safety equipment.

He said his company had started the ISV project in 2011-12 to establish itself as a major player in the boat building industry. Since 2011-12, its turnover had risen from ₹80 crore to ₹200 crore.

Hajee said the company was also supplying craft to the ONGC to ferry men and materials to its offshore structures. "For rapid movement of men and material, our fibre, high-speed, lightweight vessels are better suited and more economical. Earlier, oil companies were using helicopters for the purpose," he said. Aliasgar Hajee, managing partner, said SHM was striving for innovation and indigenisation in tune with the navy's programme.

Visakhapatnam: Partnering the Indian Navy indigenisation programme, Mumbai-based shipbuilder and marine safety, security and integrated logistic provider SHM Shipcare has delivered 14 immediate support vessels (ISVs) to the Indian Navy for patrolling the nation's offshore assets.

The Ocean Crewer is a FRP boat capable of achieving 35 knots using waterjet. This boat not only has high speed but also offers comfort to the passengers. It is under consideration of the oil companies for transport of crew to the offshore oilfields. It is much more economical than the helicopters and three times faster than the conventional crew boats, he explained.

The range of products manufactured by the SHM would be on display at the Maritime Exhibition organised here as part of the International Fleet Review.

SHM Shipcare is the largest FRP boat manufacturer, life-saving and fire fighting service provider in India and aims to build on its experience and expertise to provide top quality solutions at internationally competitive prices, Mr Saifuddin Hajee said.

The company has designed and deployed an ambulance boat for the Vinobha Bhave Hospital and is right now operating on backwaters, Mr Aliasgar Hajee said.
